


If yes, is your Emergency Operations Plan consistent with the DuPage EOP template from 2019?


Common Terms - Emergency Response Terms:




Does your district have a reunification plan? 32 responses

Kane County ROE bought I Love You Guys via a grant to Kane County Observed the need for:

- Lots of Safety Vests
- Lots of people needed
- Common process
- Common procedure
- Centralized process of printing needed materials

Take away:

- Last memory in a bad situation cannot be our lack of enough people, supplies, and process.
- Training we need more
- We're gonna need a ton of cooperation

INTRODUCTION - During an emergency, families may become separated and require assistance in locating loved ones. Families may also arrive at the site of an incident, potentially putting themselves in danger and impeding emergency response. Having a designated place for survivors and families to congregate and a structured process to match them to one another provides for a sense of comfort, security, and stability. Moreover, secondary objectives may be met during this process, including the provision of counseling services, support of law enforcement investigations, and unaccompanied minor care, if needed. A Family Reunification Center (FRC) is established to achieve these goals and provide short-term support to survivors and families immediately following an incident. 















Training for Reunification - I Love U Guys



Developing the Agreement

Parties to the IGA/ICA for Mutual Assistance in Response to Crises in the Public Schools of DuPage County, Illinois

- DuPage County State's Attorney
- DuPage Regional Office of Education
- The Boards of Education of school districts in DuPage County,
 Illinois who have approved the Agreement
- The governing entities of DuPage County special education and other cooperatives who have approved the Agreement.

Legal Authority and Purpose

- The parties' rights and powers granted under Article VII, Section 10 of the Constitution of the State of Illinois
- The Illinois Intergovernmental Cooperation Act, 5 ILCS 220/1
- All other rights and powers vested in the Parties by their respective governing statutes.
- The purpose of the Agreement is to develop and implement programs
 designed to provide mutual aid in crises, primarily arising out of disaster or
 violence in DuPage County School Districts and Cooperatives.
 - Including training to prepare members response and recovery efforts.

Administration of the Agreement

- The Agreement shall be administered by the Regional Office of Education, by its Regional Superintendent of Schools, acting as chair of an Advisory Panel.
- The Advisory Panel consists of:
 - State's Attorney or designee; Regional Superintendent of Schools or designee;
 - One superintendent selected by the superintendents of participating school districts with a student enrollment of 1,000 or less, of more than 1000 but less than 7000, of more than 7000;
 - o one director, selected by the Cooperatives of the School District Parties;
 - not more than two superintendents selected by the RSS to ensure the Advisory Panel has members from an elementary district, a high school district and a unit district.
- These members are not parties to the Agreement or subject to dues.

Fiscal Matters

- Each School Board and Cooperative shall contribute \$250 toward the administration of this Agreement for the remainder of the 2022-23 school year.
 - This fee will be used primarily to provide materials and equipment including, but not limited to, "call out" technology, credentials, Go Bags, and safety vests.
 - **■** Panel recommends budget purchases to the Regional Superintendent.
- Each School District providing facilities, materials and/or equipment to another School District under the auspices of this agreement shall not charge for such facilities, materials or equipment and for the cost of loss or damage to the facilities, materials and/or equipment.

Fiscal Matters





- Each School District is responsible for any benefits, compensation, liability insurance and worker's compensation insurance for its personnel that are providing authorized mutual aid to another School District.
- Nothing is this agreement shall operate to bar any recovery of funds from any third party, state, or federal agency under existing statutes, or other authority.

Insurance and Liability

- Each Party is responsible for obtaining insurance coverage for its participation under this Agreement, which shall be primary, and which shall waive subrogation against all other Parties.
- Each Party shall be responsible for Workers' Compensation insurance coverage of, and liability for, the Party's employees who participate in the Programs.
- A Party shall not be liable to another Party:
 - 1) for the acts or omissions of its employees providing assistance to another Party when requested under this Agreement;
 - 2) for a Party's declination to provide assistance when requested by another Party under this Agreement. For purposes of this paragraph, "liability" means liabilities, losses, damages, claims, demands, judgments, causes of action, costs, expenses, and reasonable attorneys' fees.

Insurance and Liability

 Notwithstanding anything to the contrary, nothing in this Agreement voids or limits any liability protection established by law or any existing insurance coverage of the Party. Nothing in this Agreement, the actions of the ROE, the Advisory Panel or the development and implementation of the Programs shall create a duty or liability to any person or entity which is not a party to this Agreement or diminish any liability protection for the benefit of the Parties as established by law or afforded any Party's insurance coverage.



New Parties and Withdrawal, Suspension and Expulsion of a Party

- After the effective date, a School District or Cooperative shall become a Party to this Agreement when the RSS receives this Agreement in counterpart, signed by its President and Secretary.
- A Party may withdraw from this Agreement effective at the close of the day on June 30 of any year by giving at least 60 days' written notice of withdrawal to the RSS.

New Parties and Withdrawal, Suspension and Expulsion of a Party

- By a vote of at least two-thirds of the members of the Advisory Panel, a
 Party may be suspended or expelled as a Party to this Agreement, and
 denied participation in any of the programs, for good cause, which
 includes, but is not limited to, failure to meet the requirements of this
 Agreement or of the programs.
- Before expulsion or suspension, the Party shall be given a written notice summarizing the reasons for the proposed action and an opportunity to respond to the Advisory Panel.

- Use the people you have. If you need help, ask for it. Even in this small 30 minute exercise, things get busy quickly.
- Goal: Account for students and staff, then reunify them.
